Here, I express my heartfelt thanks to these persons who work tirelessly, both in the forefront and in the background in their respective departments in helping us to realize the successes which we have enjoyed to date and in forging ahead for the overall advancement of education in St. Vincent and the Grenadines.

The Ministry of Education, Government of St. Vincent and the Grenadines takes very seriously, the provision of accurate data on the education system, which can be used to craft policy recommendations for the further development of the sector. Reliable data is also required to ensure that monitoring of policy initiatives which are in the process of being implemented, is effective and that the initiatives are achieving the intended aims and objectives of specific interventions. The provision of sound educational statistical information has the potential to avert these possible pitfalls.

The Ministry of Education in St. Vincent and the Grenadines continues to analyse initiatives and their impact on student performance and ultimately, on productivity and national development, even as the education system adapts itself to meet the diverse and evolving needs of students and teachers.

The role of data collection and analysis is being put more sharply into focus as a means of charting and tracking the impact on the quality of education of the various inputs. Too often, conclusions are drawn and assumptions made on the basis of cursory observations of events taking place in the education system. There must now be a sound basis, undergirded by accurate data, upon which such conclusions are based and decisions made. Any improvement in the quality of the educational services provided in our schools has to

be assessed and attributed to initiatives taken in the sector. It is therefore critical that all such initiatives are analysed using accurate baseline data. 
Introduction



Early Childhood Education

Presently, there are one hundred and twenty five (125) early childhood centres. Of these, 116 are privately operated while the remaining nine are (9) government institutions. Together, all 125 institutions cater for children between ages three to five years. There are currently 366 children enrolled in the nine government owned early childhood centres and another 3233 in the remaining 116 privately owned institutions which are managed by Church Boards, non-governmental organizations, community groups and other private entities. This partnership between the government and private institutions to provide early quality care and development to all pre-schoolers is in keeping with the government's thrust towards the achievement of universal access to Early Childhood Care and Development (ECCD).

Significant progress has been made towards the improvement of the quality of the teaching and learning process in this sector. The government has provided assistance to upgrade the physical environment of a number of privately operated early childhood centres. Also, the State continues to provide on-going training for preschool teachers and supervisors. Additionally, the government provides an annual subvention to all privately operated early childhood centres with an enrolment of fifteen or more students. The overall aim is to ensure that all preschool children access quality early childhood education at minimal or no cost to parents. Cost reduction and improved access is of even more significance for those children residing in disadvantaged communities who would otherwise be unable to access early childhood services.

This section of the digest provides important data on the Early Childhood Sector for the academic year 2013-2014 on enrolment, staffing and their level of training.




Primary Education


The primary enrolment for 2013-2014 stands at 13,427. This indicates a drop of 182 students below the 2013 figure which stood at 13,609. The declining primary enrolment, noticeable since 1995, is reflective of the overall decrease in population. There are currently sixty eight (68) primary institutions of which 57 are public. Eight (8) of these primary schools are in the Grenadines. As stated in the St. Vincent and the Grenadines Population and Housing Census Report 2001 there was a decrease of 2.3% between 1991 and 2001. Further analysis of this trend in the population would be facilitated when the finalized 2012 Census Report becomes available.

Primary education continues to receive the largest share of the education recurrent budget with salaries, wages and allowances accounting for 96% of the allocation. The recurrent allocation for primary education in 2014 is \$41,440,700 which is a slight increase over the 2013 estimates of \$39,480,00. The primary system continues to receive a sizable proportion of the budgetary allocation as the Ministry of Education strives to improve the quality of education throughout the sector.

The following section of the Statistical Digest provides data regarding student enrolment, student performance, the number of repeaters by institution, dropouts, the number of teachers in each institution and their qualifications as well as the expenditure for this sector. Each of the above categories is further disaggregated by district, institution and gender as appropriate.




Secondary Education


Secondary Education in St. Vincent and the Grenadines is provided by 26 institutions, 19 of which are public. The remaining seven schools are owned by churches but operate with substantial financial assistance from the Government. These seven schools are referred to as Assisted Secondary (AS) schools. Of the twenty-six (26) secondary schools, twenty-three (23) are situated on Mainland of St. Vincent and three (3) are in the Grenadines – two on Bequia in the Northern Grenadines and one on Union Island in the Southern Grenadines. Twenty two secondary schools are co-educational. There are two single-sex, all-male, secondary schools and two single-sex, all-female, secondary schools.

In June 2014 the first cohorts of Grade 6 students sat the Caribbean Primary Exit Assessment (CPEA) administered by the Caribbean Examination Council (CXC) and performed quite creditably. Of the 1948 students registered, 1934 wrote the final examination, 1022 males and 912 females. The preliminary results indicated that 1510 (78.5%) achieved the prescribed standard. Of the 912 females, seven hundred and ninety eight (798) or 87.5% met the required standards, while of the 1022 males, seven hundred and twelve (712) or 69.67% met the required standards. All students were given a place at a secondary school in accordance with the Secondary Student Placement Policy of the Ministry of Education.

For the 2013-2014 Academic Year, the overall enrolment at the secondary level stood at 10,342 pupils a total of 5035 females. At the end of the academic year 2013-2014 students in secondary schools from Forms One to Four along with all secondary school teachers were presented with brand new Acer laptops. The Ministry of Education continues to invest significant amount of resources in its ICT in Education Development Thrust.





Tertiary Education

The St. Vincent and the Grenadines Community College (SVGCC) is the lone state-owned institution that provides post-secondary/tertiary level certifications. This college is an integrated body which brought together the A Level College, Technical College, Teachers College and the School of Nursing. The Community College has four divisions that include: The Division of Arts, Science and Humanities, Division of Technical and Vocational Education, Division of Nursing Education and Division of Teacher Education. The College is governed by the St. Vincent and the Grenadines Community College Act 2005 and is managed by a board. The subvention allocated to the college for the 2014 was EC\$ 12,250,000.

A number of persons are accessing university level training locally. The University of the West Indies, Open Campus which is a regional university campus offers several online degree programmes. There are also a number of foreign medical colleges with campuses on the island. These medical colleges cater primarily for foreign students however, there are a few Vincentian students enrolled at some of these campuses. The National Accreditation Unit has started the process of registering all tertiary institutions operating in St Vincent and the Grenadines. To date five such institutions have been registered these include: St. James University, Trinity Medical College, All Saints Medical School, National Centre of Technological Innovation Inc. (NCTI) and the St. Vincent and the Grenadines.
