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Foreward from the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Education



The Ministry of Education is once again happy to present its annual statistical digest for use by all stakeholders in education. We are indeed elated to report that we have seen improvements in the performance of our nation's children at all the regional examinations from the Caribbean Primary Exist Assessment (CPEA) to the Caribbean Advanced Proficiency Examination (CAPE). At the primary level we moved from 78.08% in 2014 to 80.90% in 2015 in the Caribbean Primary Exit Assessment. Similarly, at the secondary level, the overall pass rate in the Caribbean Secondary Education Certificate (CSEC) increased from 71.16% in 2014 to 75.16 in 2015. Finally, the Caribbean Advanced Proficiency Examination overall pass rate improved from 87.71% to 89.42%. As the Minister of Education, I am cognizant of the fact that these accomplishments have not been realized without the tireless efforts of the dedicated pupils, the support of our concerned parents and last but by no means least the assiduous efforts of our teachers who go above and beyond the call of duty to ensure the success of those entrusted to their care. I pause at this time to say thanks to everyone who has made these sterling accomplishments possible.

For the new academic year, let us all endeavour to work together towards the development of our nation's children. There will be challenges ahead, but together we share the burdens and navigate around the challenges which we encounter. We are ultimately aware that the rewards of our labour will be sweet as we see the continued shining performance of our pupils and the advancement of the nation.

Message from the Permanent Secretary- Mrs. Nicole Bonadie-Baker

The Ministry of Education continues to receive substantial funding for its initiatives through various governmental and bilateral agreements. We have seen considerable progress to date as is shown in the increased numbers of institutions at the respective levels, coupled with the increased number of trained personnel deployed at our schools. The overall improvement in student performance has been recognized by the Caribbean Examinations Council, which noted that St. Vincent and the Grenadines has made significant improvements over the years in its pass rates for CCSLC, CSEC and CAPE in comparison to its regional neighbours.

Regrettably, much of this success is masked by the fact that the statistical data which is currently captured is unable to reflect the number of persons who are inhibited from participating beyond the levels of basic education. Some students underachieve by dint of the fact that they live in households which are marginalized and are consequently unable to benefit fully from attendance at school, as they experience abuse, neglect and other forms of social challenges. Teachers are hard pressed to address all of these issues and concerns which these students face, and some teachers are then unable to facilitate the improvement and sustainability of the major interventions that have been made within the education sector over the years, which have been aimed at improving overall productivity in the Vincentian economy as students graduate from the education system.

Further to the statistics collected by the Education Planning Unit in the Ministry of Education, the unavailability of tracer study data from the St. Vincent & the Grenadines Community College (SVGCC) on the employment of graduates from the post – secondary level at minimum, therefore gives policy makers no indication of the achievement of the deliberate goal of government to increase the overall national productivity amidst the current financial and economic constraints which have been experienced worldwide over the past seven years approximately.

It is hoped that the different stakeholders throughout the Education System who are charged with the responsibility of providing complete, concise and accurate data, will cooperate with the Education Planning Unit in an effort to avoid regression or reversal of the gains made thus far. Since the commencement of the Education Revolution in 2001, there has been an unprecedented injection of investment within the education sector of St. Vincent & the Grenadines and which will continue during the next five year period of implementation of the new Education Sector Development Plan.

Government, through the Ministry of Education, will have to increase its focus on the monitoring, evaluation and reporting of achievements within the sector, in order to assist our inter-ministerial and private sector partners, who are currently charged with man-power planning at the macroeconomic level. Statistical data is even more importantly required to convince our international bilateral and multilateral partners that major capital investments made over the years have not only been put to good use, but have yielded very high returns to the economy of St. Vincent and the Grenadines on the whole, in spite of failure to meet several of the originally targeted outcomes.

The Ministry of Education will continue with its pragmatic approach to the provision of quality data on the Education System, in order to build on the foundation established over the years.

In the thrust to improve the overall quality of education, the collection, analysis and use of data are annual activities which have become pillars in our practice. Accurate and reliable data are to be used as the basis for evidence-based decision making in all areas of the provision of educational services including planning, budgeting and the allocation of human, financial and material resources.

The data which are presented in this digest are used to provide quantitative reports to the policy-makers and for reporting to the stakeholders in the education system. Qualitative reports are presented elsewhere but really ought to accompany these statistics so as to construct the true image of the education system, highlighting its accomplishments as well as the areas in which deficits might remain.






Introduction





Early Childhood Education

Presently, there are one hundred and twenty five (125) early childhood centres. Of these, 116 are privately operated while the remaining nine are (9) government institutions. Together, all 125 institutions cater for children between ages three to five years. There are currently 323 children enrolled in the nine government owned early childhood centres and another 3019 in the remaining 116 privately owned institutions which are managed by Church Boards, non-governmental organizations, community groups and other private entities. This partnership between the government and private institutions to provide early quality care and development to all pre-schoolers is in keeping with the government's thrust towards the achievement of universal access to Early Childhood Care and Development (ECCD).

Significant progress has been made towards the improvement of the quality of the teaching and learning process in this sector. The government has provided assistance to upgrade the physical environment of a number of privately operated early childhood centres. Also, the State continues to provide on-going training for preschool teachers and supervisors. Additionally, the government provides an annual subvention to all privately operated early childhood centres with an enrolment of fifteen or more students. The overall aim is to ensure that all preschool children access quality early childhood education at minimal or no cost to parents. Cost reduction and improved access is of even more significance for those children residing in disadvantaged communities who would otherwise be unable to access early childhood services.

This section of the digest provides important data on the Early Childhood Sector for the academic year 2014-2015 on enrolment, staffing and their level of training.


Primary Education


The primary enrolment for 2014-2015 stands at 13,363. This indicates a drop of 64 students below the 2013-2014 figure which stood at 13,427. The declining primary enrolment, noticeable since 1995, is reflective of the overall decrease in population. There are currently sixty eight (68) primary institutions of which 57 are public. Eight (8) of these primary schools are in the Grenadines. As stated in the St. Vincent and the Grenadines Population and Housing Census Report 2001 there was a decrease of 2.3% between 1991 and 2001. Further analysis of this trend in the population can be facilitated from the 2012 Census Report.


Primary education continues to receive the largest share of the education recurrent budget with salaries, wages and allowances accounting for 96% of the allocation. The recurrent allocation for primary education in 2015 is \$38,922,107.

The primary system continues to receive a sizable proportion of the budgetary allocation as the Ministry of Education strives to improve the quality of education throughout the sector.

The following section of the Statistical Digest provides data regarding student enrolment, student performance, the number of repeaters by institution, dropouts, the number of teachers in each institution and their qualifications as well as the expenditure for this sector. Each of the above categories is further disaggregated by district, institution and gender as appropriate.

There has been a continued decrease in pupil enrolment from 2009 -2010 through to 2014-2015 from 14,534 to 13,363. Similarly, overall leaver rates range between 0.2% to approximately 0.8%. While dropping out, and migration are only two elements in the list of the reasons for the premature exit of the primary cycle, they are significant components in determining the leaver rates. Disaggregation of the figures by sex, indicates that, in 2013-2014 males were more likely to drop out while females were more migratory. However, in 2014-2015 males were more likely to both likely to drop out and or migrate thereby exiting the system prior to the completion of the primary cycle.






Primary Schools In St. Vincent and the Grenadines Table 31 : Actual Enrolment in Primary Education, 2000/01 to 2014 / 2015



Secondary Education

Secondary Education in St. Vincent and the Grenadines is provided by 26 institutions, 19 of which are public. The remaining seven schools are owned by churches but operate with substantial financial assistance from the Government. These seven schools are referred to as Assisted Secondary (AS) schools. Of the twenty-six (26) secondary schools, twenty-three (23) are situated on Mainland of St. Vincent and three (3) are in the Grenadines – two on Bequia in the Northern Grenadines and one on Union Island in the Southern Grenadines. Twenty two secondary schools are co-educational. There are two single-sex, all-male, secondary schools and two single-sex, all-female, secondary schools.


In 2014 students sat the Caribbean Primary Exit Assessment (CPEA) administered by the Caribbean Examination Council (CXC). The CPEA replaces the national Common Entrance Examination (CEE) which previously determined which students obtained the chance to attend the secondary school of their choice. However, all students in accordance with the policy of the Ministry of Education will be offered a place at a secondary school. The criteria for secondary school selections will remain as established by the Ministry of Education. In 2014, primary pupils performed quite commendably on the new assessment with an overall pass rate of 78.08%. There was a subsequent improvement in 2015 to 80.90%.

There has been a continued decrease in pupil enrolment from 2009 -2010 through to 2014-2015 from 11,140 to 10,287. Similarly, overall leaver rates range between 2.2% to approximately 4.2%. In the secondary cycle, disaggregation of the figures by sex, indicates that, males were generally more likely to drop out and migrate than females. This was observed both in 2013-2014 and 2014-2015.



Tertiary Education

The St. Vincent and the Grenadines Community College (SVGCC) is the lone state-owned institution that provides post-secondary/tertiary level certifications. This college is an integrated body which brought together the A Level College, Technical College, Teachers College and the School of Nursing. The Community College has four divisions that include: The Division of Arts, Science and Humanities, Division of Technical and Vocational Education, Division of Nursing Education and Division of Teacher Education. The College is governed by the St. Vincent and the Grenadines Community College Act 2005 and is managed by a board. The subvention allocated to the college for the 2015 is EC\$ 13,100,000.

A number of persons are accessing university level training locally. The University of the West Indies, Open Campus which is a regional university campus offers several online degree programmes. There are also a number of foreign medical colleges with campuses on the island. These medical colleges cater primarily for foreign students however, there are a few Vincentian students enrolled at some of these campuses. The National Accreditation Unit has started the process of registering all tertiary institutions operating in St Vincent and the Grenadines. To date five such institutions have been registered these include: St. James University, Trinity Medical College, All Saints Medical School, National Centre of Technological Innovation Inc. (NCTI) and the St. Vincent and the Grenadines Community College.
